JA ImpleMENTAL





- Mental healthcare delivery system reform in Belgium
 - lead: Germany/Italy
 - 14 countries (11 implementing, 3 participating/non-implementing)
- Suicide Prevention Austria SUPRA
 - lead: Austria, Czechia
 - 17 countries (14 implementing, 3 participating/non-implementing)
- The EU Commission initiated the Joint Action ImpleMENTAL (Oct 2021, 36 months)
- Overall budget: 6,7 million Euro, 80% EU-co-funding
- ≥ 21 countries and 39 organizations are involved

> SUPRA is 1 of 2 technical WPs of JA ImpleMENTAL

WP6 "Transfer and pilot implementation of (selected elements of) of the Austrian Best Practice on Suicide Prevention (SP) "SUPRA"

Lead: GÖG/Austria, Co-Lead: MoH/Czech Republic

Partners from 17 countries, 14 of them implementing countries: Austria, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czechia, Estonia, Finland, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Lithuania, Malta, Norway, Serbia, Slovenia, Spain and Sweden,





Main objectives of WP6 Suicide prevention

- Overall: Support improvement in knowledge and quality of suicide prevention services
- - > transfer and pilot implementation of the Austrian Best Practice SUPRA
 - develop and/or (if already in place) further develop, scale-up suicide prevention strategies of participating countries comparable to SUPRA
- No 1:1 roll-out of SUPRA but:
 - taking into account the respective <u>national/regional context</u>, <u>select specific elements</u> of SUPRA and bring them to <u>implementation</u>





Tasks → Outputs (deliverables, milestones)

- record and assess the current situation in the field of suicide prevention in each country/region (SA) → national country profiles
- obtain stakeholder commitment for the establishment (or further development) of a national/regional strategy including steps to promote increased awareness for SP
 → involving working groups / advisory boards, resulting in SP strategies
- promote learning and cross-country exchange on methods, tools, practices and experiences → exchange, networks, coordination, collaboration
- Support capacity and competence building of stakeholders → trainings
- Support the sustainable establishment, improvement and expansion of suicide prevention services → adaption and pilot implementation of SUPRA

- work on **country profiles and strategy development** will be started soon





Examples for prioritized measures, quick wins

Prioritized measures:

Oreating/merging hotline/s, identifying hotspots and safeguarding railways, gatekeeper trainings, postvention, upscaling of crisis centres, coding and follow-up, registry/data, collaboration with media, increase communication and information e.g. on positive examples of how to deal with crisis, suicidal behaviour and loss, support-services, further education and training of professionals (health, schools...), promote research, support for risk groups, activitites to reduce stigma

Quick wins

Oreating/updating website, hotline, guide for primary care professionals, upscaling of e-training, implementation of suicide risk coding in further regions, organization of events, creating awareness, bringing together stakeholders (committees, events), collaboration, networking

Key benefits and challenges

Benefits:

- exchange, sharing experience, learning
- networking, collaboration, creation of structures
- mutual interest, agenda setting, dissemination, information
- situation analysis, needs assessment
- creation/revision of suicide prevention strategy

Challenges:

- <u>WP-level</u>: heterogenous structures of health/social system, very different status of suicide prevention in different countries
- <u>National level</u>: Lack of budget, motivation of stakeholders/commitment, pilot implementation (coordination of many actors), institutional constraints, lack of resources, personnel, work overload
